San Francisco - Pick up your rig and begin your adventure with your first stop in Napa Valley.

Napa Valley

Bliss. If one had to try and describe the Napa Valley in one word and one word only, 'Bliss' would be it. Rolling hills, sprawling meadows, old growth oak trees and manicured vineyards all basking in the warm California sun.

Napa County has over 300 award-winning wineries dotting the valley. It is no surprise that that the most popular tourist activity are guided tours and wine tasting - an excellent way to experience the Napa Valley.



Redwood National and State Park

The Indians called this "a place of spirits". Feel the same awe-inspiring wonder that civilizations felt hundreds of years ago. Explore the TREES OF MYSTERY. You'll be overwhelmed by the unusual redwoods.

During the summer months, children of all ages will marvel at Paul Bunyon (standing at 49 foot 2 inches) as he waves and welcomes them to the Trees of Mystery along with his 35 foot tall friend, Babe the Blue Ox.

Enjoy a picturesque hike, ride a gondola that gives you a bird's-eye view of the redwoods, and see breathtaking mountain, forest and ocean vistas.



Lassen Volcanic National Park

Provides a wealth of fun activities that are as varied as the seasons of the park. Enjoy breathtaking vistas, hiking trails, a scenic drive and a must stop includes Sulphur Works, which showcases an active hydrothermal area.



Sacramento

California's Capitol City offers a wide-range of undeniable attractions to please every member of your family. Walk through Old Sacramento, tour the Governor's Mansion and visit the surrounding park. Take a stroll along the Shorewood Harbor Marina, or better yet, take advantage of their water craft rentals and experience the water for yourself. Go whitewater rafting on the Sacramento River or bring out the night owl in you as you explore some of the nightlife Sacramento has to offer. Columbia

Through the years it has kept much the same appearance as when miners roamed its streets. So Columbia was protected and today thrives as Columbia State Historic Park. The town's old Gold Rush-era business district has been preserved with shops, restaurants and two hotels.





There are opportunities to ride a 100 year-old stagecoach, pan for gold, and explore the real working businesses of

Columbia.



Yosemite National Park

On the way to Yosemite, stop at Bodie State Park and see an original ghost town from the late 1800's. Bodie stands today in a state of "arrested decay".



So coined by the State of California when they took over the town in 1962 to make it a State Historic Park.

"Incredible" is the word that comes to mind the first time you visit Yosemite. Wildlife, ancient trees, mountain waterfalls—this great wilderness calls RV campers back again and again. You will experience why Yosemite National Park is one of the most-visited National Parks in the US.



Yosemite Valley is most familiar to Yosemite National Park visitors, the Valley is home to Yosemite Falls, the highest waterfall in North America, as well as Bridalveil, Sentinel and Ribbon Falls, just to name a few. Not to be outdone by the Falls for scenic beauty are stunning rock formations such as El Capitan, Half Dome and the Royal Arches.

Morro Bay

Morro Bay is a working fishing village. Its famous landmark, Morro Rock, was named by Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo when he first charted this coast during his 16th Century voyage of discovery. The town is a pleasant tourist destination which has very mild weather all year long. There is no such thing as traffic in Morro Bay, unless, of course, you count birds, sea mammals, and fish!



Monterey

Monterey is beautifully situated on Monterey Bay and highlights everything that's best about California.
